# From the Pastor

## God will NEVER leave or forsake us!

The following letter includes excerpts from two emails sent to our disciples from Pastor Brunette on May 25 & 26:

To the family of disciples at Cornerstone Lutheran Church,

Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

As you know, on the morning of May 25 at Noblesville West Middle School, a shooter entered a classroom and fired a weapon, which resulted in the injury of a student and a teacher. The student, teacher, and their families are disciples of Cornerstone Lutheran Church.

The teacher is Jason Seaman, and he and his family attend worship at our Fishers site. Jason is recovering very well from his injuries and truly believes that God put him in the right place at the right time, using him to save lives. He also knows that it was by God's grace that he survived. The student is Ella Whistler, and she and her family worship at our Carmel site. Ella is still recovering in the hospital, but expected to make a full recovery. Following the shooting, Ella's first requests were for prayer and worship music. Ella too, knows that it was God who saved her, and all those who encountered her were amazed by her faith.

Jason and Ella know the promise of Psalm 121:1-2; *I lift up my eyes to the mountains—where does my help come from? My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth.* On behalf of these families, I ask for your prayers as they cope with the outcomes of this terrifying act. Please know that our pastors are ministering to these families and our church will be supporting them in the days and weeks ahead.

In addition to this student and teacher, we have many other CLC families who have students that attend this school as well as other Noblesville schools, and are also dealing with the emotional aftermath of the shooting. You and your family may be one of them. If you would like some one-on-one time for your family to talk to one of our called staff members, we encourage you to reach out to them and schedule an appointment. We are here for you!

We might ask, "How could this happen?" We may not ever know the answer, but we as God's own people rely on the sure promises of our gracious God who reminds us, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." (Hebrews 13:5) Even in the midst of tragedy, "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." (Psalm 46:1) In these uncertain times, it's important for us to shine our lights in our communities and be bold in our faith. May


our friends and neighbors see in us the words of Psalm 27:1; *The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid?*

What a blessing you all are to me and to each other. The prayers and encouragement shared in support of these families has been overflowing. 

# Statue Dedication

## CLC Foundation unveils and dedicates "The Risen Christ"

The Cornerstone Lutheran Church Foundation, acting as trustees for the Columbarium and Prayer Garden located outside of the Hasse Prayer Chapel at the Carmel site, unveiled and dedicated a life-size marble statue entitled "The Risen Christ" on Sunday, May 13. It sits on a marble base as a focal point in the center of the area. The base carries an inscription from John 11:25, "I am the Resurrection and the Life".

When the columbarium was designed, the architects identified this location as the best place for such a reflective piece. When several memorials were received in memory of Bud Roth, who was inurned there last July, his wife Cathy asked if they could be used for this purpose, which completes the intended design of the area. The

Foundation Board of Trustees consulted with the architect as to size and material and an appropriate statue was identified. Once additional donations from six additional memorials and three individual donors were received to cover the cost of the statue, the Board approved the purchase and installation.

Please stop by and visit this impactful and symbolic addition to this reflective space. It can be viewed from the Prayer Chapel as well as the hallway areas across from the Senior Lounge and room 100. For those who would like to visit the area during "off hours" it can be accessed through the gate facing Gray Road. The Foundation's gratitude goes out to Cathy Roth who provided the catalyst for the project, to Gayle Carlson who coordinated the purchase and installation, and Dave Smith who has adopted the ongoing maintenance of this area as a labor of love.

# Right Now Media

## How to access RightNow Media through your TV

RightNow Media (RNM) is an enormous faith-based video library available to disciples at Cornerstone as a means for personal and family devotion and group Bible study. It can be accessed through any computer or device with Internet connection.

A Roku is an affordable device that enables you to stream movies, TV shows, and much more over your home internet connection to your television. This includes RNM videos. The following link provides more information about Roku and alternative ways in which you can access RNM through your various devices: [support.rightnow.org](http://support.rightnow.org).



Below is a comparison from [howtogeek.com](http://howtogeek.com) of the various types of Roku:

- **Roku Express, \$30:** This is the cheapest option, and probably good enough for most users.
- **Roku Express+, \$40:** This is identical to the Express, but comes with an A/V cable for use with older TVs that don't have an HDMI port. Only sold at Wal-Mart.
- **Roku Streaming Stick, \$50:** This is Roku in an HDMI stick form, complete with a voice search remote.
- **Roku Streaming Stick+, \$70:** This is the cheapest Roku to offer 4K and HDR compatibility, and works with Wi-Fi at a longer range thanks to a USB-powered receiver.
- **Roku Ultra, \$100:** This is the only current Roku with a microSD card. It also offers voice search from the remote, and an ethernet connection.
